met with the 10 leaders of ASEAN
(Association of Southeast Asian
Nations) and called for action on
human rights issues in Myanmar.
More directly, **Obama urged**

**Myanmar's prime minister, Thein Sein, to release democracy leader,
Aung San Suu Kyi** as well as other political prisoners in Myanmar.

President Obama's support comes at the perfect time. His words add fuel to the fire that Amnesty International supporters started a long time ago. And come December 5-13th, Myanmar's leaders will see just how brightly our flame can burn.
